POSITION DESCRIPTION

This internship will use graphic and written creative skills to assist the communications efforts of Make-A-Wish Wisconsin in various media.

GOALS

- Real-life experience in the communication/graphic design field
- Create a communication piece from concept through production to include in a portfolio
- Develop a broad understanding of work in the non-profit arena
- Understand and experience the power of a Wish.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Make-A-Wish® Interns are required to fulfill the Make-A-Wish University School of On-boarding Volunteer Series. The Foundation will provide direction for accomplishing these online sessions.
- Creating invitations, brochures, greeting cards, or other design projects as needed
- Creating graphics for use on Chapter Web site / Facebook page
- Scanning/retouching photographs & organizing for use in various media
- Assisting with photo and video opportunities as needed
- Other projects within the realm of communications

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be a currently-enrolled student seeking a design-related college degree
- Working knowledge of Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator & InDesign software required
- Excellent written, verbal and visual communication skills required
- Strong organizational, interpersonal and time management skills
- Ability to manage multiple projects and meet deadlines

TIME REQUIREMENTS

- Student must be able to work within a consistent schedule during normal office hours 12-15 hours per week and a minimum of 10 weeks.
- The number of hours per week will vary due to the amount of responsibility assumed, events, etc. Attendance at evening or weekend events may be necessary.

COMPENSATION

- This is a volunteer position. To enable the receipt of college credits, Make-A-Wish Wisconsin will work with you to meet your school's requirements.
- A \$500 stipend based on a minimum of 100 hours will be paid upon the satisfactory completion of the internship. Hours to be determined between student and Communications Department.
- Any work incurred work-related expenses will be reimbursed.
